against Welches were unavailable at press time. However, Turin said he doesn't feel too badly about his chances in the district tournament.

"(The players have) been practicing well lately and I think they'll do real well," Turin said. "It's hard to say."

During the first half of the regular season, Sandy IV was quite successful, winning all of their games before losing their first game to Welches.

Members of the team who provided leadership and talent were pitcher Jacob Hannings, pitcher Eric Ansen and first baseman Brandon Kerbs, who was batting over .600 prior to Tuesday's contest.

"This is a really good group of kids," Turin said.

PONYTAIL GIRLS, B-DIVISION II: This softball team, made up of 11- and 12-year-old girls from Sandy and Bull Run, went 12-1 this season, losing its first game of the district playoffs to Rockwood, but came back in the double-elimination tournament to win the district championship at Boring July 8-9.

"The girls knew they could win the tournament and, with a positive mental attitude they did just that," said coach Rita Johnson. "Not one player let up. They stuck by each other with all the fight they had."

Six games were played in the

weekend tournament, playing three games Saturday and three Sunday — one after another.

According to Johnson, the players tired as the days progressed. However, their determination progressed similarly and won in the semifinals, 20-18.

In the championship game, which was played 20 minutes after the conclusion of Sandy's semifinal game, Sandy gave its all in a 30-9 district championship triumph.

Some of the highlights in the game included an outfield-to-catcher throw to get the runner out from centerfielder Erin Dobin to catcher Nicky Johnson.

Also adding to the highlights was a three-run home run hit by pitcher Shawna Ayers.

The infield combination of first baseman Kenda O'Neill, shortstop Mindy Zimmerman and second baseman Kelly Key made several important defensive plays in the game, adding to the success of the squad.

The team, sponsored by Bull Run Concrete and Construction, has declined to continue playing in the state tournament playoffs because of conflicting schedules of many of the players on the team.

PONYTAIL GIRLS, B-DIVISION I: Stuart York was the coach of this softball team,

which was third in the same district playoffs won by Johnson's team.

JUNIOR FEDERALS BOYS: This team, coached by Nelson Smallwood, qualified to play in the state tournament by finishing fourth in the district playoffs recently.

The team will play in the state tournament at Hillsboro July 29-31. Smallwood could not be reached for comment Tuesday.

SENIOR NATIONALS BOYS: Sandy Summer Baseball and Softball Association President Mike Kadunc wasn't planning to coach this year, but, due to lack of coaches, accepted the responsibility of coaching the Sandy Senior Nationals.

He is probably glad he did, as the team finished fourth in the district tournament, but, since the team played in the National League, which sends only the top two teams to state, missed out on a state berth.

JUNIOR NATIONALS BOYS: Coach Dan Lawyer led this team to a third-place finish in the district tournament, coming very close to qualifying for state, but was unable to play in the district championship final.
