

Environmental Law Alliance to Travel on BIOFUELS

The Environmental Law Alliance Worldwide will bring environmental leaders from around the world to Eugene and the Oregon Coast this year. ELAW wants to reduce the environmental impact of transporting these leaders to and from the Yachats meeting site.

This year ELAW has chartered bus service from OC&W Coachways – the largest charter bus service in the Willamette Valley – to make the trip on B20 BIODIESEL – a blend of 20% BIODIESEL and 80% petroleum diesel. By using B20 BIODIESEL, ELAW will keep 120 pounds of carbon dioxide out of the atmosphere. Carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas that contributes to climate change. "We are excited to offer ELAW the option to charter this trip on 20% American-made, renewable biodiesel," said John Mikulich, manager of OC&W Coachways' Eugene location.

The OC&W bus will fill its tanks at the new SeQuential Biofuels station on McVay Highway at the I-5 exit near Lane Community College. "With the opening of our new station, blends of renewable biofuels are now an option for everyone in the Eugene area," said Ian Hill, SeQuential Biofuels co-founder and Eugene resident. *In addition to BIODIESEL blends, the SeQuential station offers gasoline with 10% BIOETHANOL that is approved for use in ALL gasoline engines.*

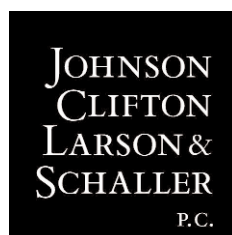

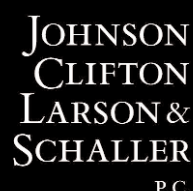
