EUGENE TOXICS BOARD SEEKS SEVENTH MEMBER

The Eugene Toxics Board is a volunteer advisory body to the Eugene City Council, overseeing the City's progressive and informative Toxics Right-to-Know Program. The Toxics Board meets several times per year to address policy, budget, and emerging issues.

Currently the Board has six members: three who have a demonstrated history of advocating for the public's right to know, and three representing local manufacturers required to report under the program. A seventh member is needed. By City Charter, the seventh member must be nominated by at least four of the other six members. All seven members have full voting rights.

Although there is no other eligibility requirement for the seventh member, an interest in environmental issues and/or experience in manufacturing may be helpful.
