## In Afghanistan

- **1,931 U.S. troops killed\*** (1,927)
- **15,672 U.S. troops wounded in action** (15,594)
- **1,131 U.S. contractors killed** (1,131)
- **\$522.1 billion cost of war** (\$520 billion)
- **\$154.2 million cost to Eugene taxpayers** (\$153.6 million)

## In Iraq

The war officially ended in December 2011 with a total of 4,422 U.S. troops killed, 31,923 wounded in action and undisclosed hundreds of U.S. military suicides. But U.S. contractors are assuming a larger role, high levels of U.S. spending continue, and the body count from civil unrest grows.

- **1,563 U.S. contractors killed** (1,560)
- **116,170 to 1.2 million civilians killed\*** (116,107)
- **\$803 billion cost of war** (\$802.4 billion)
- **\$237.1 million cost to Eugene taxpayers** (\$237 million)
