Perhaps no stagework in the past 50 years has had the cultural impact of Tony Kushner's Pulitzer-winning *Angels in America*, a two-part play (*Millennium Approaches* and *Perestroika*) set in mid-1980s New York and focused on a handful of compelling characters struggling with the broad implications — spiritual, emotional, political, psychological — of the growing AIDS epidemic during the late stages of the Cold War and Reaganomics. Lane Community College's theater department is tackling Kushner's masterwork, in separate and overlapping parts, in a production that will highlight the playwright's fantastical “Theatre of the Fabulous.” LCC Theater faculty lead Brain Haimbach directs part one, and Anna Parks directs an “enhanced reading” of the second part. For fans of the stage and anyone interested in understanding the zeitgeist (both where we were and where we are now), *Angels* is essential viewing.

Angels in America: A Gay Fantasia on National Themes plays April 24-May 3 in LCC's Ragozzino Performance Hall, 4000 E. 30th Ave.: *Part One: Millennium Approaches* runs 7pm Friday & Saturday, April 24-25, as well as 7pm May 1; *Part Two: Perestroika* receives an enhanced reading 7pm Thursday, April 30, and 2pm May 3; both plays will be presented Sunday, April 26, starting at 2pm. \$5-\$10, tickets at 463-5161 or wkly.ws/1x6.
