The funny thing is, Jim Smircich doesn't much like rock music. He was just a man with a camera, in the right place at the right time. The wild, profound, historic 1960s San Francisco rock scene blossomed right before Smircich's eyeballs, and he caught it all on film. Smircich, who now lives in Eugene, was childhood friends with once-and-future rock god Paul Kantner. So when Kantner and Marty Balin formed Jefferson Airplane in 1965, Smircich had front row seats. When psychedelic rock was in its heyday, Smircich's photos of Jefferson Airplane and other Bay Area legends — Jimi Hendrix, Janis Joplin, the Dead and Quicksilver Messenger Service — graced the pages of a then-relevant *Rolling Stone* magazine and became iconic album covers. Documentarian Darrell Jabin tells Smircich's story in his newest short film ***A Rock & Roll Photographer... The Published and Unpublished Works of Jim Smircich***, which screens this weekend at the downtown Eugene library. It's enough to make you want to keep a camera handy at all times, just in case things get good and weird again.
