It should be mentioned, though, that the event isn't just a naked bike ride for the sake of a naked bike ride. The ride brings thousands of people together every year in support of body-positivity, bike safety and human-powered transportation as an ecological alternative, and since it's technically a protest, according to Portland World Naked Bike Ride's website, it's perfectly legal. Also, there is no requirement to get completely naked. The dress code is "as bare as you dare," according to the website. 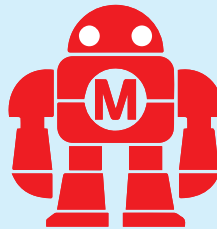
