NOTICE

To All Brookings-Harbor, and Residents

in this Vicinity Who Desire to be served

With Electric Power:

Prior to further expansion of the present electric power service in this area it is necessary for all property owners to sign an easement for power lines right-of-way, by, through or on their property.

According to state law, before construction can commence on a power line, an easement must be signed by the property owner, permitting permanent placement of these line. Even though the poles of a power line do not actually set on an individual's property, the overhang from the cross-arms would be over private property, and the wire leading from a pole to a house or building would necessarily pass over privately-owned land.

We had originally intended to let out the construction for our projected expansion to a private contractor, but because of the difficulty in obtaining the services of such contractor and the delay involved, we are forced to undertake this construction ourselves. By our doing this construction, rather than a contractor, it will be necessary for us to secure the signing of these easements at once.

Just as soon as you sign these easements, work will begin on the staking of the lines, the setting of poles, etc., until all requests for electric power are filled.

It is suggested that, where the owner does not live on the property, he be notified immediately and if possible send him an easement to sign. In this way, you will help speed up this expansion program, and the sooner everyone will have electricity.

Easement blanks may be had by calling at our local Brookings-Harbor office, and B. L. Cleveland, our local manager, will give you any further information you may want.

We feel sure we will have your full co-operation in getting this job done.
