

How Many Families Are In This Area? The Pilot Would Like This Information

To determine how many copies of the Brookings-Harbor Pilot to print for the first two issues, the publishers tried to make a survey of the area, in an effort to determine the number of families living in the area. The job was something to be reckoned with. It was pretty well established through questioning the local postoffice that 550 families get mail at Brookings. Harbor has about 150 families—but, the remainder of the area—therein lies the answer to the Pilot's question. It is the hope of the Pilot to miss no families with the first two issues, and this desires has created the problem for the management.

Estimates from various people in the area range from 800 to 1200. Arthur Crook, county commissioner, believes 1200 would be a conservative estimate. But estimates do not answer questions when paced against the time element, as it has been with publication of this first Pilot. As an arbitrary figure 1100 of the first issue will be printed, with the forms being held for a couple of days, just in case this estimate is too low. Suggested Project For C. of C. This information, while vital to the Pilot, is also very much so for all people of the area. For that reason, it is suggested that the local chamber of commerce appoint a committee, or make this survey.
