State School Men Inspect Brookings School Facilities

constructed of green lumber and was improperly constructed.

To fully meet the needs of the Brookings-Harbor area, it was suggested that a new school building be constructed of a flexible type of construction that will permit adding in units of two at a time. They suggested that with this type of unit construction, it was possible to add to the school building as the need arises and as financing allows.

The school board ultimately plans for a six-unit grade school and a six-unit high school, which will eventually mean two separate buildings.

Calls Special Board Meeting—

A special meeting of the school board is called Thursday, March 21, at which time board planned to ask the voters of this area for permission to use the present available funds for remodeling the present building.

However, in view of the meeting held this week, the board is calling an informal meeting prior to Thursday's meeting to acquaint all members of the school board with the findings of R. D. Huffaker and Mr. Emerson, and to offer an entirely different proposal to the voters.

It is contemplated that the board will ask the voters to vote \$20,000 funds, in addition to the present available funds. This would be accomplished by a proposed \$10,000 serial levy over a five-year period, and a request for a special levy of \$10,000 to make up the \$20,000 for the basic new school building. This will allow approximately \$10,000 for repairs on the present building, which are immediately necessary and which must be done irrespective of whether the new construction is approved or not.
