

Fire District Will Name Board At The May Election

within the district. A special tax levy of not exceeding ten mille on the dollar may be authorized by a majority of the legal voters at a special election called for that purpose.

The fire district will also have

the power to borrow money, and to sell and dispose of general obligation bonds, not exceeding 5% of assessed valuation, provided a special election is called and the majority of the voters vote approval.

The legality, financing, and direction of a rural fire district is governed by state laws, and the conduct of a rural fire protection organization is directly accountable and responsible to the state fire marshal.

It is expected that the truck and equipment now controlled by the Brookings-Harbor volunteer department will become the property of the fire district. It is the advice of equipment manufacturers that with the installation of a standard fire pump and other miscellaneous items that the present truck and its 500-gallon booster tank will amply serve the district for a time at least.

Congress Okays Chetco Project

Of special interest to residents of the Brookings-Harbor area is the column one article carried in Wednesday's paper, which told of congress' approval, among all the projects, the Chetco. The story, for benefit of those who did not see the account in the paper:

WASHINGTON, March 19 AP—A \$360,000,000 appropriation for rivers, harbors, flood control and other war department civil functions passed the senate Tuesday on a voice vote.

It goes back to the house for action on a \$74,000,000 increase by the senate.

Except for \$19,800,000 for the Panama canal and small sums for miscellaneous operations of other units, all of the money is for rivers, harbors and flood control.

Oregon Project. In—

Among projects in the bill as passed by the senate, and the amounts provided for each:

Rivers and harbors— Gulf intercoastal waterway between Apalchee Bay, Fla., and the Mexican border (Galveston district), \$2,030,000; Trinity river, Texas, \$1,490,000; Neches and Angelina rivers, Texas, \$1,500,000; Columbia river between Vancouver, Wash., and Bonneville, Ore., \$439,000; Columbia river at Bonneville, \$805,000; Columbia river, at Umatilla (McNary dam), \$5,000,000; Columbia and tributaries above Celilo falls to mouth of Snake river, \$30,000; Brazos Isabel, Tex., \$127,000; Sturgeon Bay and Lake Michigan ship canal, \$11,000; Wrangell narrows, in Alaska, \$1,000,000.

In addition to money for the construction projects, the appropriation includes funds for advance planning for scores of new projects by the army engineers.

Among these and the appropriations for each are:

Rivers and harbors — Chetco river, Oregon, \$2000; Depoe Bay, Oregon, \$1000; Snake River, Ore., \$500,000.

Flood Control — Quartz creek, reservoir, \$130,000; Sweet Home, reservoir, \$100,000; Nehalem River, basin, \$2500; Arlington, (Alkali canyon), \$4000.
