### Chamber Only Civic Body Working For Area Development

There are any number of people in this area, who wish to do something for the community, but find themselves at loss what to do and just how to approach the matter.

Since the community is unincorporated, with no city council to shoulder the burdens of civic matters, there remains but one organization to function along this line—that is the Brookings-Harbor chamber of commerce.

Membership in this organization is the first step of the average citizen toward a better community, for improvements, for progress. Matters coming before this group are discussed, committees are appointed to tackle the problem, and action, as best possible is taken toward realization. Since the area is unincorporated, there are no taxes toward civic improvements. Such must be realized in other ways—by and through donations, of money, work, or by assistance from the county or state.

In this area, 100 members, or more, are necessary to get a complete cross-section of the community. Under the \$1-per-month membership dues plan, this enables the organization to have a little money to carry on some of its many functions.

Membership in the organization entitles the holder to these privileges:

1. To take an active part in the shaping of the future of the area;

2. An opportunity for the individual to aid the community development by injection of his personal work and ideas;

3. The opportunity to mold, at the very beginning, the policies which will go far toward an area of 10,000 or more population;

4. An opportunity to leave a heritage for the families which will move to the area to make their homes.

Someone has said: "One never gets more out of anything than he is willing to put in." One can never, by the same token, expect any more from a chamber of commerce than he is personally willing to devote to the organization. *Your membership is needed—now!*

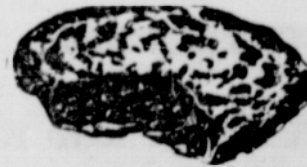
