each other is a self-evident truth of co-operation, it is a principle that men universally accept. Two men can build a house better than one, three are even better, then four, and so on, depending on the size of the house. One man may not be able to move a stone alone, neither may two or three; ten might—but again that depends on the size of the stone. Ghizeh built the Great Pyramid, but he didn't do it alone.

"By growers working together the lily bulb industry gains greater and greater strength. The greater the industry grows in strength, the greater will be its bargaining power, the more secure its markets, the greater the possibility of an overall quality product, with a consequent reduction in hazards to the individual grower. As growers recognize the potentials of co-operation through working in harmony for their mutual benefit, I feel sure that they will join the co-op. I wish all of those who are interested in developing the future of the industry were in now. I like to feel that on this trip that I have the confidence of the entire industry."

I shall do my utmost to serve the entire industry and develop harmony and understanding between growers, jobbers, forcers and the retail trade. All of us have to work together."

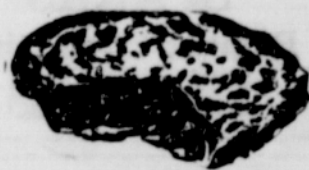

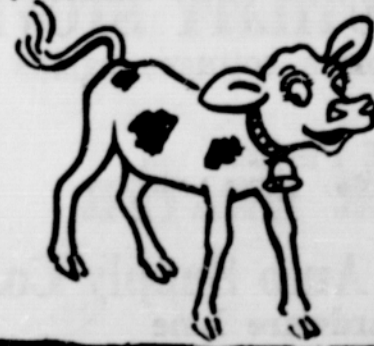
