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showing disease immediately upon its detection, also that the probabilities were that proposed certification would necessarily demand that the inspectors were satisfied that every plant in the field upon which certification is desired shall be absolutely of an approved variety.

Clark also advocated the further propagation of lily stock through the mother block method and stated that his opinion was that indiscriminate stem propagation was probably responsible for the spread of infection; that all plants should be removed which do not measure up to field standards, even including backward plants appearing in a row of otherwise normal development.

He also stressed the fact that wet, undrained ground could be regarded as unfit for lilies due to their failure to grow at all or even well, because of "mud rot."

After the meeting on the Rogers patch the party went to the Carson tract, in Harbor, to witness a demonstration of power spraying.

It was emphasized that field inspection, this year, will be more frequent and more rigid than before and that such data as the department of agriculture gathered was for their files, only.

Both Mr. Clark and Mr. Cole state that their inspection of Easters being forced in greenhouses between Eugene and Salem showed the normal bud count as opposed to various reports, less favorable, received from eastern ranges.
