NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the legal voters of School Dist. No. 17, of Curry County, Oregon that a SPECIAL SCHOOL MEETING of said District will be held at the School House on the 22nd day of April, 1946, at 8 o'clock p. m. for the following objects:

To authorize the District School Board to secure plans and begin construction of a new school house from funds now available.

To vote upon the question whether or not School District No. 17, Curry County, Oregon, authorize the District School Board to levy annually, beginning July 1, 1946, for Five (5) years a special district tax levy of \$10,000 per year to provide a fund for construction, re-construction, improvement, betterment, repair and equipment of schools.

To vote upon the proposed budget increasing the tax levy over the amount limited by Sec. 11, Article XI, State Constitution.
