Nation-wide campaign to conserve food for family relief got under way in Curry county this week at an organization meeting of the USDA advisory committee at Gold Beach. Dr. W. A. Cartwright, mayor of Gold Beach, was named county chairman.

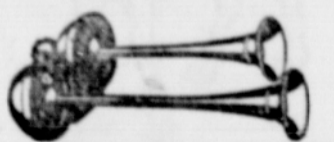
