How many former neighbors of yours are there living within the area reached by the Pilot? Wouldn't you like to know?

Here is how you can find out—how you can meet up with folks who originally came here from your home state:

If you are 18 years of age, or older, get your mail at Brookings, Harbor, Pistol River, or Smith River post offices, drop the Pilot a card, with your full name, address, and post office address at which you were born. If a married lady, between your given and your husband's last name, enter your maiden name: Thus—

Mrs. Mary (Jones) Smith, Harbor, born at Rock Cliff, Wyo. Beginning with the May 9 issue of the Pilot, names received will be published in the following groups, one group a week. Delay has been made so as to give every reader a chance to send a card with his name and address, and also to allow time for the person (if not already on the list) to come in to subscribe to the Pilot, so as not to miss a listing of people from your home state.

The first group on each weekly list will be the native Webfeet (Oregonians)—get your names in quickly, so it will be easy to compile the list. And the rest of you folks—backward Aksarbens, those from the state that's round at both ends and high in the middle, Hoosiers, Down Easters, those who got away from California or Texas, or from the spud state—let's have your cards, thick and fast, so you won't be left out—AND BE SURE TO SEND COMPLETE DATA—we can't make corrections and want to get you lined up right with others from your state.

TELL YOU NEIGHBORS!

Here's the order in which the lists will be printed each week:

1. Oregonians; 2. New Englanders; 3. New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania; 4. Maryland, Delaware, D. C., Virginia, West Virginia; 5. North and South Carolina, Georgia, Florida; 6. Kentucky, Tennessee, Louisiana, Alabama, Mississippi; 7. Texas, Oklahoma; 8. Missouri, Arkansas; 9. North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa; 10. Minnesota, Michigan, Wisconsin; 11. Montana, Wyoming; Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico; 12. Washington State; 13. California, Utah, Nevada; 14. Ohio, Illinois, Indiana; 15. Those born outside the United States.

And, in the meantime, start planning to call on the folks from your home state. Arrange picnics or pot-luck feeds at the beautiful Azalea State Park, on Mill Beach, or any one of the hundreds of places your Oregon home offers for your enjoyment. HOWEVER, all those not on the Pilot list must subscribe so as not to miss anything.
