State Will Attack Accident Problem

The soaring rate of traffic casualties on Oregon highways and streets will be attacked from two angles during the next few weeks. Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, said, early this week.

1. Traffic law enforcement agencies of the state and nation are co-operating in a Traffic Safety check program, which began on May 15, and will run for six weeks. During this campaign, po-

lice officers will check brakes, lights, tires and other equipment on vehicles stopped during routine enforcement activities.

2. Scientific training in modern accident prevention methods will be offered police officers, city engineers and teachers at the Eighth National Institute for Traffic training, to be held at Oregon State College in Corvallis, June 17-28. At this institute nationally known traffic experts in the three fields of enforcement—engineering and education—will conduct classes in modern accident prevention methods.

"These two programs are the first steps in the implementation of the nation-wide program, now adopted by the President's Highway Traffic Safety Conference in Washington early in May," Farrell said. "The police safety check system will serve to focus public attention on the importance of preventive maintenance and the observance of good driving practices."
