

Civilian Teachers Needed In Japan

Women may receive one-third of the appointments now being made for civilian instructors under the army education program in Japan and Korea. Academic instructors must hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent and have had at least two years successful teaching experience in an accredited educational institution. Teachers of trade school subjects are considered on an individual basis. Schools established for military personnel comprising the army of occupation in Japan and Korea are offering courses at the high school, junior college and trade school levels.

Salaries, including the overseas differential, range from \$3,725 to \$4,550 for instructors meeting army qualifications. The transportation to and from the Pacific theatre will be furnished by the war department, and departure schedules are being arranged for June, July and August. Appointments will be for a year,

although this may be limited to nine months in exceptional cases. Instructors are being selected now for the following subjects: social studies, physical science, political science and government, agriculture, English, mathematics, accounting, business administration. Also needed are instructors in electricity, radio, machine shop, welding, heating and ventilation, plumbing, carpentry, cabinet making, blueprint reading, shop mathematics, mechanical drawing, commercial subjects, music, art and literacy training.

Applications and letters of inquiry should be directed to the Army Educational Instructor Selection Office, 205 East 42nd St., New York, 17, N. Y., and should be accompanied by two copies of U. S. Government Form 57, now available at any civil service branch office.

Larger Packages May Be Sent Overseas Soldiers

Limitations on the weight and size of packages which may be mailed to army personnel overseas have been raised substantially, according to a recent announcement of the army postal service.

The new weight limitation is 70 pounds, and a maximum measurement of 100 inches in length and girth combined is now permitted. Not more than one parcel will be accepted for mailing in any one week by the same person or concern to the same address, and each package must contain only those items specifically requested by the addressee. The signature of the soldier making the request together with descriptions of the articles desired, his name, grade, and company or unit address must be shown postal authorities before parcels will be accepted for delivery at an APO outside the continental United States.
