ANDON — State police and volunteer rescue workers from Coquille pulled the body of Noah Thomas Keith, 36, of 3729 Trenton Ave., North Bend, from the Coquille river just below Riverton at 10:30 Sunday, 12 hours after the car driven by Keith went over the river, resulting in his death and injury to a companion. The companion, Howard Joe Keith, 32, of North Bend, escaped from the submerged auto by his swimming, but did not remember how he did it, he told police. Keith was driving a 1930 Ford coupe at the time of the accident.

which happened at the sharp bend of the highway at the farm owned by Dr. J. D. Rankin of Coquille, just below Riverton.

The car was recovered earlier Sunday. State police believe that Keith's body fell out when the completely submerged car was moved. The body was found by state police and LeRoy Swinney, and Clarence Sommers of the Coquille rescue squad, grappling a short distance from the bank in 30 feet of water.
