GINGERBREAD MIX

8 cups sifted flour
2 cups sugar
2 tblsp soda
3 tblsp. ginger.
4 tsp cinnamon.
1 typ cloves.
2 c. (1 lb.) lard.
Sift dry ingredients together. Cut in lard until mixture looks like cornmeal.

GINGERBREAD: In a bowl, put 1 egg, add 1/2 cup. mild molasses, 3 cups mix. Blend, add 3/4 cup hot dater. Stir until batter is smooth. Pour into greased 8" square tin, bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 30 minutes. Cut into nine large squares. To vary, split squares, fill with sliced bananas or other fruit, top with whipped cream, custard or pudding sauce.

GINGER BREAD CAKES: Use recipe above to make 20 small cup cakes, using greased muffin tins. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. To vary, top with confectioner's icing, dip into shredded cocoanut, grated chocolate nuts.

GINGER BREAD ROLL: In a bowl, beat 1 egg, add 3/4 cup mild molasses, 3 cups mix and 1 cup hot water. Blend until smooth, pour batter into 15" x10" pan, greased and lined with wax paper. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) 20 minutes. Remove from oven, let stand seven minutes, cut off crisp edges. Turn onto a cloth dusted with confectioner's sugar, remove paper. Spread with cream filling or orange marmalade, roll, wrap in cloth, let cool on rack. Serve with custard sauce.

GINGER BREAD WAFFLES: In a bowl, beat 1 egg, add 1/2 cup mild molasses, 3 cups mix, 3/4 cup hot water, 3 tblsp melted butter. Bake. Makes 8 small waffles. Top with whipped or ice cream for a delicious dessert.
