

### State Aid Due Vets with Disabilities

Oregon veterans with disabilities incurred outside of service thereby not coming within scope of Veterans Administration are reminded that they are entitled to assistance from state division of vocational rehabilitation, it was pointed out week by department of veterans affairs officials.

This division of the state department of education provides physical diagnosis, physical restoration, if needed, vocational guidance and vocational training to the needs of disabled persons, supervisor Charles F. Feike explained.

It is said that while set up to help all citizens of Oregon, the aid is available as well to veterans whose disabilities are such that they are not entitled to aid under Public Law 16 for disabled veterans.

Division Agent Milton E. Coe said a veteran in Dayton, for example, had been in the army two years and was discharged due to a previous injury. He received training from the state and is now working as a repairman.

Another veteran in McMinnville was discharged 59 days after ending service because of a back

injury suffered in his high school football days. He has now applied for pre-dental schooling through the rehabilitation office, not being eligible for this training from the Veterans Administration.

By virtue of the state's program for the handicapped, it is possible for a veteran to get additional aid in completing his college education after using up his GI rights under Public Law 346. A case was cited at Oregon State College where a veteran, eligible for three years of GI schooling, will have his last year of training paid by the state because of a physical handicap which was not service-connected.

Depending on the man's need, the state defers such costs as tuition, tools, and training supplies, it was explained. Veterans seeking this help were advised to write the division of vocational education, state library building, Salem. An agent of the division will call later in their home communities.

**COQUILLE** — Tentative arrangements have been made to call back the June circuit court term grand jury Monday, June 24, to consider the case of Thomas Alan Coleman, 15, who shot and killed his father, Dolf Smith Coleman, at their Big Creek ranch home, June 10.

A coroner's jury decided no one was criminally responsible for the elder Coleman's death. After the inquest, Thomas was taken before County Judge L. D. Felsheim, who remanded the case to circuit court and asked that a grand jury make a further investigation.

The information filed in the lad's case states that "while defending his mother and his own person," he shot and killed his father. Judge Felsheim decided not to make the lad a ward of the court and left him in his mother's custody.

Judge Felsheim's order states "regardless of the extenuating circumstances which appear to the court to have justified the act, the act is of such serious nature that the court is duty bound to remand the case to the Coos county grand jury so that the evidence in the case may be fully considered by that body in the same manner as though the said Thomas Alan Coleman were over age of 18 years when the said act was committed."
