## CURRY COUNTY LAMB SHOW SCHEDULED

At a joint meeting of the Curry County fair board, Gold Beach chamber of commerce, Women's club, and the Curry County Livestock Association, held at Gold Beach last Monday, it was voted definitely to hold the Curry Co. Lamb Show, July 20, according to H. H. Hansen, president of the board. The Gold Beach organizations offered to handle noon arrangements for the free barbecued luncheon customarily enjoyed at the show.

Sheepmen will provide the lambs, the Gold Beach Bakery will donate up to 50 loaves of bread, and all housewives whose families attend the luncheon are urged to bring cakes. Coffee, cream, and seasoning are to be provided by Gold Beach business men.

Over 25 exhibits of lambs and fleeces have been pledge by the sheepmen which was adjudged the minimum exhibit justifying the show. Many more exhibits are expected.

The premiums approved for the lamb show include a \$50 top with five premiums down to \$10 for pen of five fat lambs. Three fleeces at \$15 down to \$5 for all other classes was approved, including singles, fleece on the ewe and the wool classes.

Authorization to contribute \$25 to the Gold Beach band was approved on the assumption that the band would play during the noon hour.

## CURRY COUNTY FAIR DATES ARE SET

The board also voted to hold a county fair at the fairgrounds at Gold Beach just before the state fair, which is scheduled to start at Salem on Labor Day.

Premium money was authorized for classes of producing cows at the dairy show and \$75 was approved for a showmanship contest at the dairyman's picnic to be given 4-H club members who would also show at the fair.

The board authorized Nat Perkins and Moss Averill to put on the official county booth at both the state fair and Pacific Inter-

national and voted to match any funds raised by community organizations to defray the cost of these exhibits.

Members of the fair board present included H. H. Hansen, president; R. M. Knox, secretary; Nat Perkins, Ena Sheridan, Docia Sweet and H. S. Cadman. There was also present, Wm. W. Allen, of the Gold Beach chamber of commerce and Mrs. Hudkins, president of the Gold Beach Women's club, Mrs. Shields and Mrs. Costello, also from the Women's club. The meeting was held at Schoufler's restaurant.
