Forest Service Crew On Chetco

Two forest service crews are now working on the Chetco river roads at the present time and have their camp on the north bank road. Earl Smith of Grants Pass has a five-man crew putting in a concrete culvert at Joe Hall creek, which replaces the trestle which was used for years until this last year when a fill was put in.

Fred Gardner of Harbor, with a four-man crew, is now doing the maintenance work on State Redwood Park road, but will move to the upper Chetco this week where they will do the same kind of work. They will replace the approaches to the Upper Chetco summer bridge which was washed out last winter.

Plans are also made to build a higher bridge on the Upper Chetco next year, to replace the lower summer bridge, so that, except during high waters, the river may be crossed either winter or summer.
