visiting Mrs. Goldizen's mother.

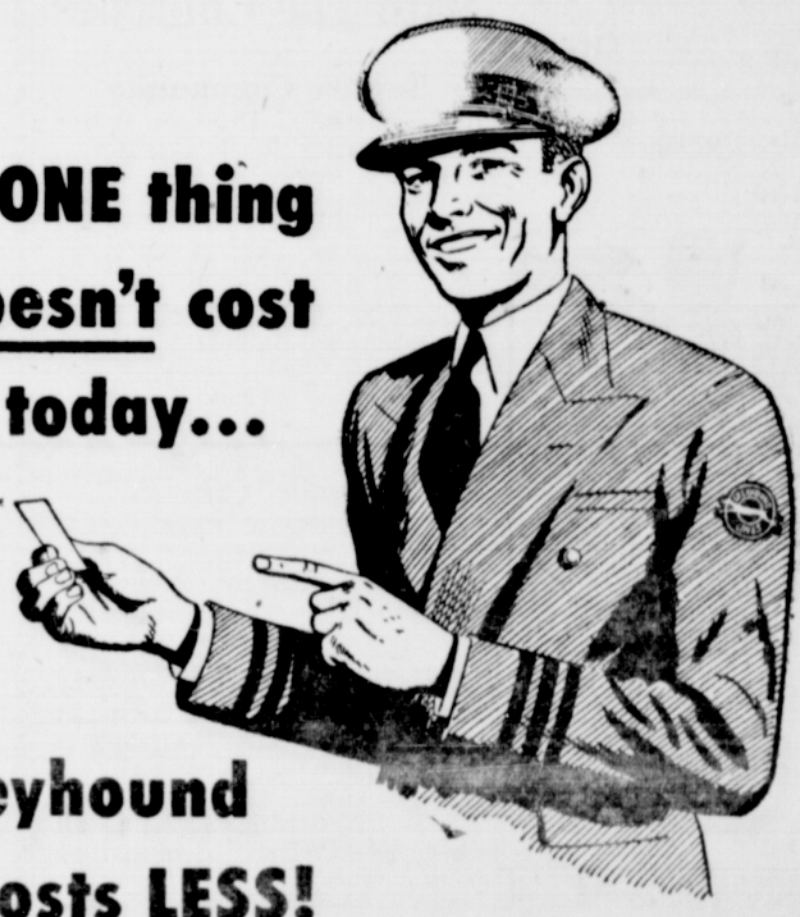
Mrs. Ben Kerns was here last
