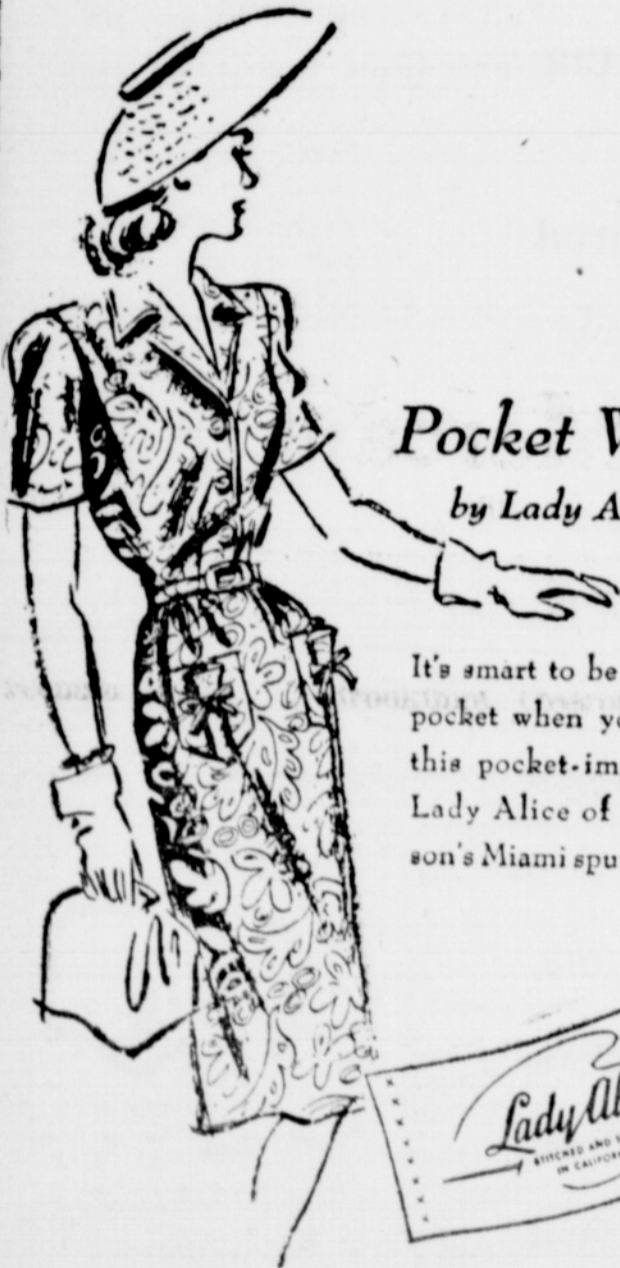

### Favorite Recipe

Mrs. Pete Woodburn, of Brookings, submits her favorite recipe this week:

#### FUDGE CAKE

- 1 cup sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 1 1/2 cups flour.
  - 2 oz. melted chocolate
  - 1/2 cup butter.
  - 1/2 cup milk
  - 2 1/2 teaspoon baking powder.
- Cream butter and sugar and add beater yolks of eggs, add milk and flour with baking powder. Beat well and add chocolate and whites of eggs which have been whipped to a stiff froth. Bake in shallow pan in moderate oven for 30 minutes or until cake pulls away from edges of pan.
