### The World Sweltered—But Here It . . .

Something for the prospective resident of this area to consider—the temperatures of the past week:

Headlines of the Portland dailies carried news of the sweltering heat experienced at places in the Willamette valley, and other Oregon localities—but at the same time, southwest Oregon, or southern Curry county, was cool and much collected.

Saturday, Medford sizzled under 115.2 degrees of heat which beat down into that canyon from almost every side. Portland, at the same time, roasted under 103 degrees of heat. For the person who is looking for an ideal location, the Pilot will re-print the first paragraph of the weather story appearing in Oregon Journal:

While most of Oregon simmered in near record-breaking heat and Medford broiled in the hottest temperature recorded in the United States, the coastal town of Brookings, only 75 airline miles away, breezily enjoyed a maximum temperature of only 65—one of the lowest maximums in the nation for the day."

Served, too, by the U. S. weather bureau under the department of commerce, weather observations are taken every three hours here. During the past week, local temperatures were:

What is striking about the Brookings weather, taking the daily

records over a year, is the evenness of the temperatures—the low range between maximum and minimum, and the average mean temperature over the 12-months period. That, readers, is something to consider a long while when locating a home to settle down.

Another factor for prospective settlers in this area, is the fact that anything, except, possibly, tropical fruits, will grow in this area. With irrigation during the dry months, gardens can be started here in any month of the year. Vegetables, especially of the type such as cabbage, lettuce, or leafy plants, grow profusely the year around. Carrots grow too large, unless these are planted in small enough plots so that all may be used and not permitted to keep growing. Certainly it never gets too hot for any vegetable.

Compare—and by this comparison prove to yourself that this area—southern Curry county, and southwestern Oregon is the ideal spot—the homeseeker's paradise.
