More Progress In Sight For This Area

Progress in this area, along the coast, was given another boost during the past week in the announcement that another sawmill, one reported to be 80,000-foot capacity, soon would be under construction between Brookings and Crescent City, just south of Fort Dick, where already excavation is being made for the mill pond.

While details concerning the construction have not been officially released by the company, it is common knowledge that the concern is no small company, is coming in fully financed to do a big job.

Perhaps many in this area will wonder just how installation of that mill will help this immediate area. Certainly, it would take no wise man to see that building materials, so necessary to the building in this community will be helped immensely. Then, too, many people of this area could find employment there if they so desired. Besides, this mill adds to the national recognition already focused on the area. Everything progressive anywhere helps the entire coastline, indirectly, if not directly.

Someone said that bankruptcy is the balance-wheel of the world, and certainly Brookings' bankruptcy of two decades ago presages a growth unheard-of in the history of the west coast, especially what may be expected of southwest Oregon.

Awaiting pictures, and free-hand sketches, used to illustrate the text, this book may be in type by the first of September. It is, however, not the wish of the author to have just an ordinary job done, and these pictures and sketches are so necessary.

A post-war project of Gideons is to place approximately 7,000,000 testaments in hands of school children in the sixth, seventh and eighth grades.

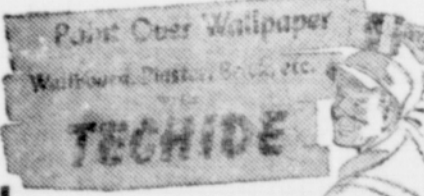
