Those who fished at Port Orford dock, Monday, were Clark Slocum, Jake White, Walter Sabin and Jim White.

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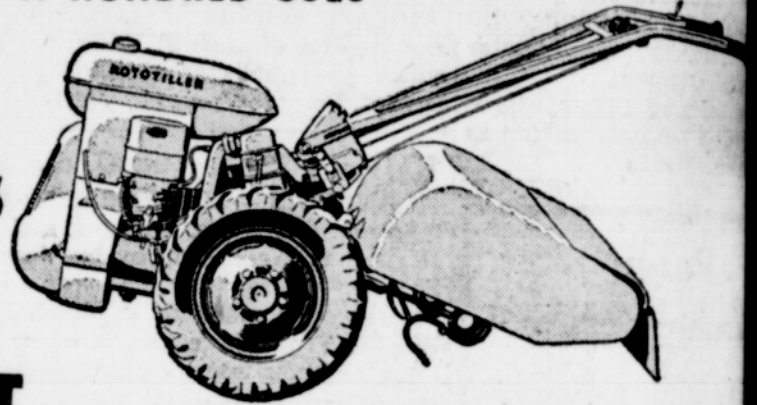
