This grower said that this information had come from an eastern buyer, upon advice from a Co-op member.

Such tactics seem to be effective to stampede people, to excite people and cause them to become panicky. Surely Prof. DeLoasch made it plain last week in his talk that quality bulbs need ever go unsold, and those of inferior

quality would likely go unsold. However, for benefit of those Pilot readers who feel that there is more than one schedule of bulb prices, here is a price list, as set by the Co-op, covering all types of bulbs grown in the area:

When a small lad, I had a read-

er that contained the story about an old lady who wouldn't keep all her eggs in one basket. Growers of this area should likewise diversify and carry eggs in several baskets. Another practice which must come about here—and that soon—is the establishment of an experimental station for all plants grown in this area. I can name at least three who would be qualified to carry on this work, and there may be two or three more equally well qualified to help out.

Experiences of the past year should have taught a few lessons. At least these lessons should be heeded. Certainly there must be a closer tie between grower and forcer, whereby mutual problems can be ironed out to maintain an understanding which will be good for the industry.

Welcome to new businesses in the area certainly is the right attitude to take on the part of all those who bought advertising in the Pilot this week to convey to the world their good wishes to the new businesses just opening.

Competition—the right kind—is good for business. Competition attracts people to an area to do their buying, and thus, with the right kind of competition among the businesses of this area, certainly the future can hold a ray of hope to people who want to make this area their home.
