

### Pine Cone Books Three Show Hits

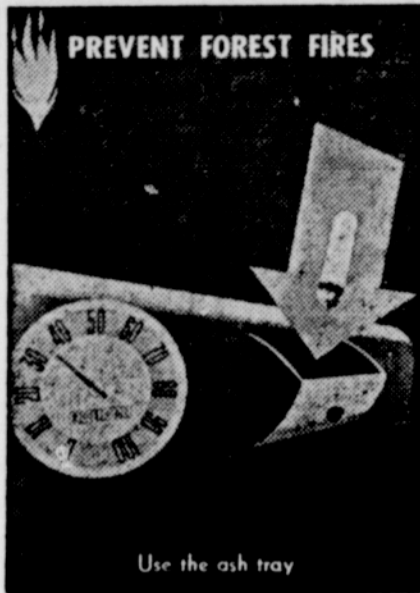
