

Veteran Affairs Booth At Fair

Veterans' booth, set up under auspices of the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs, to give the latest information and advise on rights and benefits to ex-servicemen, is one of the attractions at the Oregon State fair in Brookings this week, which is expected to attract 250,000 visitors by closing Sunday night.

The booth is located in the Agriculture building on the fairgrounds midway. Although sponsored by the Veterans' Affairs department under Director George E. ... representatives of the American Legion, the Veterans Foreign Wars, the Disabled American Veterans and the American Veterans Committee are participating in the functions of the

veterans' booth. Expert advice on all problems affecting veterans is being provided by officials of these organizations.

A brand new booklet is being distributed at the booth which contains all Oregon laws pertaining to veterans, as well as other laws which indirectly affect ex-servicemen seeking business opportunities. This is the first time state veterans' laws have been compiled for easy access.

In charge of arrangements for the booth are Don Goode and Al Crose, loan officers for the veterans' department.
