

### Favorite Recipe

Week Mrs. Mary Braynard submits her favorite

**YEAST MUFFINS**  
 (1 cake compressed)  
 5 tablespoons.  
 flour, 3 cups.  
 1 egg.  
 lukewarm water (about 80 degrees)  
 scalded milk (cooled to luke warm)  
 shortening (part butter flavor)  
 2 teaspoons salt.  
 Blend the yeast into bowl. Lukewarm water and stir solve completely. Stir 1 cup of the sugar. Let stand 5 minutes. Stir in luke warm milk mixture. Beat until stiff. Cover bowl with a damp cloth and let rise 30 minutes. Bake at 80 to 85 degrees. Mixture should feel neither warm nor cold to the touch. Place it out on a flat surface. If kitchen is cold put a closed cupboard with a hot water beside it. Rest of ingredients, stirring in, then beating just until completely mixed. Spoon by spoonful into well-greased muffin cups, filling each one-half full. Cover with a damp cloth. Let rise 20 to 30 minutes (at 80 to 85 degrees), bake at 375. This makes 12 medium muffins.
