there for several days. Rosie Potocnick will remain another week or so for medical attention before she may return home.

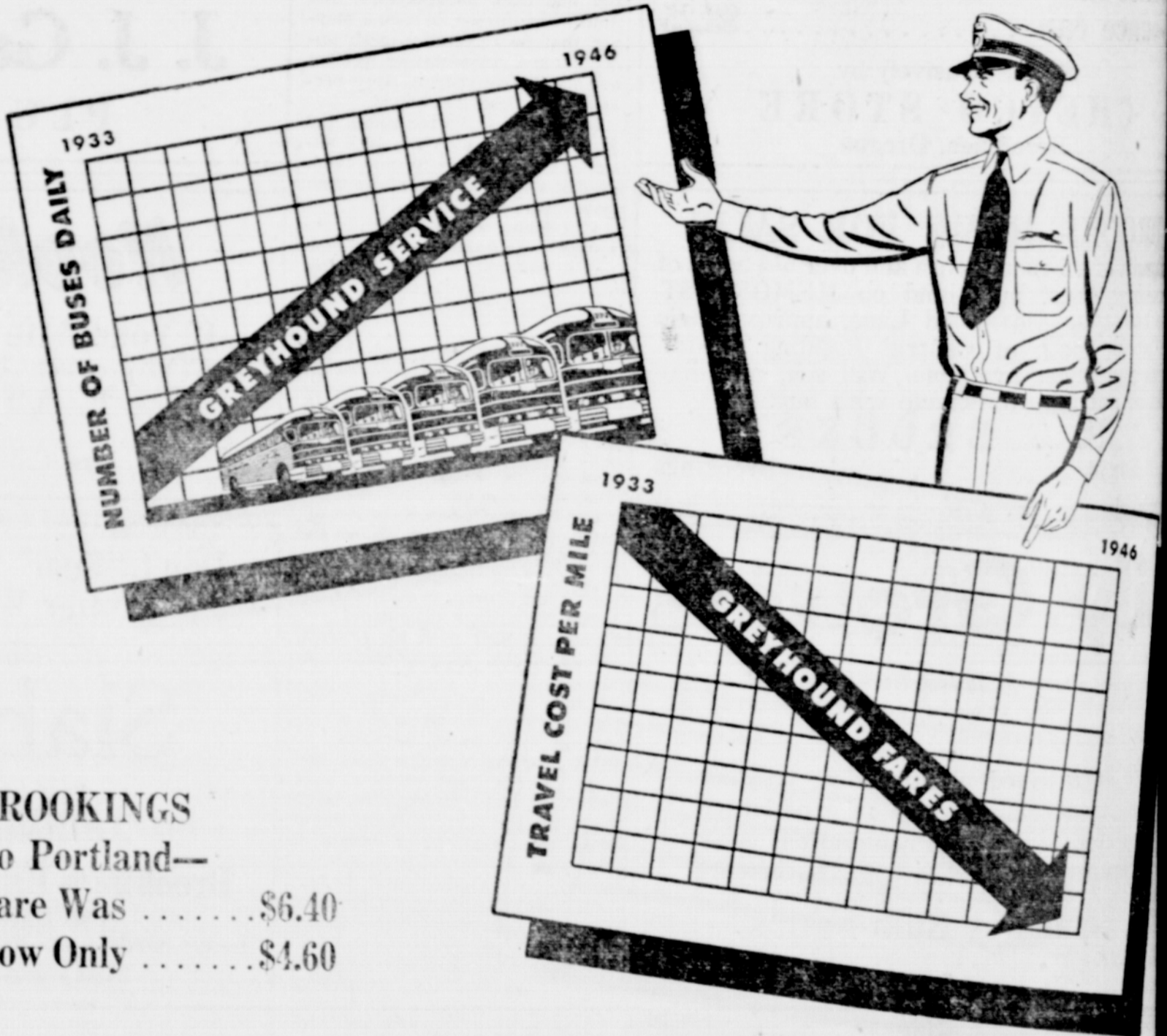
Two more new shiny cars are

seen in the Harbor area today, with some might be owners. Caesar Pedroni has a Ford sedan and Kenneth is driving a Chevrolet

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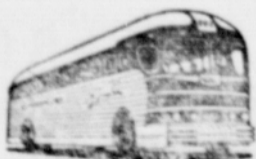
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
