- NEVER FAIL DILL PICKLES
- Cucumbers to fill a 2-qt. jar.
- 1 cup vinegar
- 3 tablespoons salt
- 1 tbspoon pickling spiced mixed
- 3 cloves of garlic
- 3 heads of dill.

Pack cucumbers in jar, adding the rest of the ingredients. Fill the jar with cold water and seal. These will work and run over in a few adys. They will be ready to use in about six weeks.
