

Were Given Ice At Salem

...l leave pay, government insurance and education and training are the three GI's uppermost in the minds of Oregon's world war 2 veterans, according to interviews with more than 300 ex-service men at the department of veterans' affairs at the state fair the first of September, Director Geo. ... reported this week.

...charge of the booth was Don ... chief service office, who ... 300 veterans were given ter ... leave pay blanks. Of this ... 300 blanks were notarized ... of charge, represented pay ... amounting to more than ... or an average of \$150

per claim. Questions regarding re-instatement, conversions, and premiums on National Service Life insurance were asked by 320 veterans, and assistance was given in reinstating lapsed policies worth more than \$250,000.

More than 400 veterans received literature and information dealing with educational benefits and apprenticeship training. Records indicated nearly 175 individuals had questions about disability pensions and benefits, 80 wanted to know about loans for homes, farms and businesses, and 50 asked about employment.

Procurement of building materials for home construction, and homesteading in the northwest, and Alaska, were other subjects of inquiry.

More than 1750 copies of the de-

partment's booklet, "Veterans' Laws of the State of Oregon," which was rushed through printing in time for the fair, were distributed. In all, between six and seven thousand pieces of informational literature were distributed from the booth.

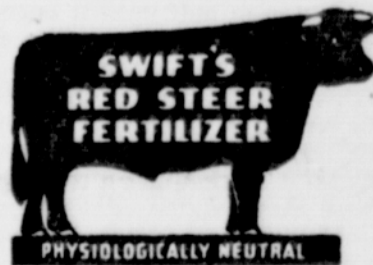
