Mrs. Kenneth Payne arrived Monday evening from Albany for a short visit with the Payne family here.

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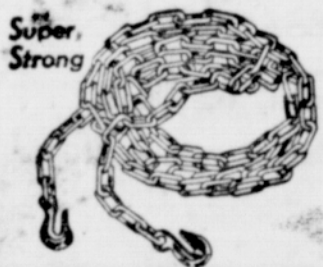
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
