### Fire Hazards Are High In Homes

Here's a check list for your home. USDA's Safety council suggests the following precautions to safeguard the home against fire: clean up waste paper and trash; keep soiled, oily rags in a metal container; use only safe cleaning fluids and work outside; keep curtains away from stove, grills and other appliances; don't smoke in bed; inspect electric cords regularly and replace when worn or frayed; keep a screen in front of open-space heaters and fireplaces; keep rugs away from fireplaces and stove; regularly inspect, clean and repair flues, chimneys and stovepipes; put ashes in metal ash cans; and above all make sure that everyone knows what to do in case of fire, and how to call the fire department. Remember, Fire Prevention Week is October 6-12.
