## Oregon Names

This is the first part of the list of Oregon names, contained in a booklet sent to the Pilot:

**Agate Beach** (Lincoln county) named for the many agates to be found along the shore.

**Albany** (Linn County) named after the capital of New York.

**Alkali** (Lake) The water is so heavy with alkaline salts.

**Alsea** (river) Named for the Alsi Indian tribe which dwelt in the area.

**Aneroid** (Lake) Stems from the Anna Royal, first white woman to visit this part of the Wallowa mountains.

**Antelope** (Wasco County) Was named for the thousands of so-called prong-horned antelope that forage on the plateau above the Columbia river.

**Applegate** (river) Honors the three Applegate brothers who were celebrated Oregon pioneers.

**Astoria** (Clatsop County) The frontiersmen sent westward by the Pacific Fur Co. established the first white settlement in the northwest at the mouth of the Columbia in 1811. They named the place for John Jacob Astor, the company's founder.

**Bakeoven** (Wasco County) A trader used a rustic bake oven to provide bread for the miners who were working the nearby gold diggings.

**Baker** (County) Edward Dickinson Baker was elected U. S. senator from Oregon in 1860.

**Barlow** (road) Samuel K. Barlow built the road by which the first wagon trains spanned the Cascade range.

**Bend** (Deschutes County) At a bend in the Deschutes river, pioneers forded this turbulent river.

**Benton** (county) Honors Senator Thomas Hart Benton of Missouri who advocated American sovereignty over the Oregon territory.

**Big Eddy** (Wasco County) The swift reaches and rapids forced travelers to portage around this part of the upper Columbia.

**Blanco** (cape) Spanish for white.

**Bloody Run** (Josephine County) Indian hostiles often attacked the

settlers at this place.

**Blue** (mountains) When seen from afar by the early settlers, this 9,000-foot range had a blue appearance against the background of green valleys.

**Bonanza** (Klamath County) This is Spanish for prosperity.

**Bonneville** (Multnomah county) Honors Captain Benjamin Louis Eulalie de Bonneville, trader and explorer of the west. The U. S. government's 518,400 kilowatt power project also bears this name.

**Breitenbush** (river) John Breitenbush was an early-day hunter

**Broken Bow** (mountain) The summit of this imposing peak is torn and jagged.

**Bully Run** (river) Many cattle escaped from wagon trains and grazed wild along this stream. It is now the source of Portland's water supply.

**Burns** (Harney County) Named for Robert Burns, immortal Scot poet who wrote Auld Lang Syne.

**Calapooya** (mountains) Many of Oregon's Indian tribes were of the Kallapooian family.

**Canby** (Clackamas county) Major-General Edward R. S. Canby, commander of the Department

of the Columbia, was slain by Modoc Indians in 1873.

**Cannon Beach** (Clatsop County) An iron cannon of the wrecked schooner Shark drifted ashore off this rocky coast.

**Cascades** (mountains) Many of the rivers tumble in foaming cascades off this lofty range. The name “Cascades” was also given to the rapids where the Columbia river breaches the mountains. The range's highest point in Oregon is Mt. Hood, 11,253 feet.

**Cathlamet** (bay) Probably from the Chinook work ‘calamet,’—stone.

**Celilo** (Wasco County) from an Indian term meaning tumbling waters. Indians salmou at this cataract. **Champooeg** (Marion County) variety of versions is given. From the Indian word meaning weed.
