Favorite Recipe

Mrs. Mark Wood submits a favorite recipe this week:

ROLLED OATS BREAD

Set to rise: 2 Fleischman yeast cakes, 2 teaspoons flour, 2 teaspoons sugar in 1 cup lukewarm water.

Scald: 1½ cups old fashioned rolled oats with 2 cups boiling water.

When lukewarm: Add 3 tablespoons molasses, 3 tablespoons melted shortening, 1 cup canned milk, 1 cup water and yeast.

Mix with flour to which 1 tablespoon salt has been added, and knead thoroughly.

Let rise, mold into three loaves. Raise and bake in moderate oven.

Mrs. Pete J. Lesmeister, this week submits her favorite recipe:

GRAHAM CRACKER PIE

Crust: Roll 16 crackers, fine. To the crumbs, 1 teaspoon flour, ½ cup melter butter, ½ cup sugar 1 teaspoon cinnamon (if desired). Mix as for pie crust: Take half of mixture and pack into pie pan to form crust, but do not bake.

Cream Filling: Make custard filling by cooking together 3 egg yolks, ¼ cup sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 2 cups milk, 1 tablespoon cornstarch. Cook until this mixture coats spoon. Four into lined pie pan. Make meringue by beating the three egg whites until stiff, adding 3 tablespoons sugar, spread over custard. Sprinkle with remaining half of graham cracker crumbs. Place in oven at 300 de-

grees until meringue is set. Lemon filling, butterscotch, pineapple cream or any cream bases may be used with crust.
