

Salmon Must Be Saved In Oregon 'Fishing Sake'

Current Problems Are Being Discussed At Gearhart Hotel

Paul R. Needham, director of the Oregon State Fish Commission, told the delegates of the Oregon Coast Association, held this week at Gearhart, that the salmon "must be saved" if the fishing remains an attraction for tourists.

Needham drew a comparison of the Oregon coast with the Atlantic coast where salmon have been so abundant that fishermen must go as far as Canada if salmon fishing is to be enjoyed. Present trends indicate that the head and cutthroat trout fishery will be gone here, unless the fishing is exercised by commercial fishermen.

Needham stated, too, that stringent regulations must be made to preserve the salmon fishing. These fish must be allowed to build back up the stocks that once ran the various streams of the coast as well as the Columbia river.

Salmon hatcheries are to be soon opened along the coast in order to

expedite re-stocking of these game fish, Needham told the crowd.

Art Kirkham Spoke, Too
Recreation is the last great hope for the Oregon Coast, Art Kirkham of radio station KOIN, told the delegates as keynote speaker of the Monday evening meeting. Timber has about been exhausted and soon will be only a minor industry. Fisheries, since the fish situation has become as it is, does not attract the industries. This, then, leaves recreation to be developed as a leading industry.

Mild weather along the coast permits year-around vacationing, thus development must, then, be planned with that in view.

Arch Sanders, association manager, urged more markings along the route, and begged for full co-operation from all members of the association.

Other speakers at the three-day meeting included Gov. Earl Snell, Robert S. Farrell, secretary of state, Chester Moores, president of the Portland chamber of commerce. Returns of elections were not known at the time this paper went to press.

Attending from Brookings are Pete J. Lesmeister, Charles H. Grayshel and Mrs. Mildred Byrne. Ralph Vincent, delegate for the chamber of commerce, was unable, due to sickness in his family, to attend.
