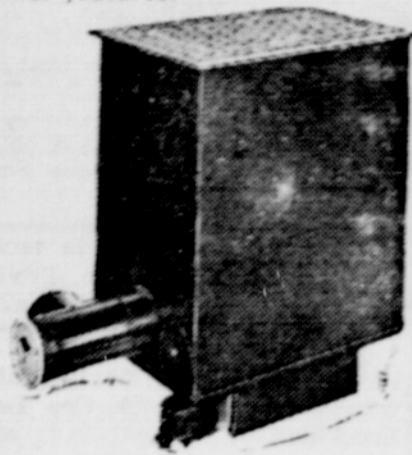

From Exchanges:

COQUILLE—Robert H. Ness, 29 said to be a member of the Jehovah Witness sect of Coos Bay, was found guilty of the charge of annoying Mrs. Patrick Murphy, office employee of the Geo. Oerding Real Estate and Insurance office Saturday by Judge Frank Leslie of the city court, but was not fined. A bail of \$15,000 set for his appearance on Monday was returned.

Mrs. Murphy had complained to the police that Ness was annoying her by staying in front of the office after she had asked him to move away. The city police officers had also asked Ness to move, but her reportedly not done so.

Judge Leslie stated that he found Ness guilty of annoying Mrs. Murphy but that it did not constitute a crime and that the bail would be returned and no fine imposed.

CRESCENT CITY—F. E. Nemecc, said to be the general manager of the Northwest Mining Co. of Seattle, Wash., is out on \$2500 bail as the result of a grand theft warrant, issue out of Sierra county.

Nemecc was arrested Wednesday by Undersheriff Frank J. Blackerby who remembered something in his files about a man by that name. Investigation indicated that Nemecc had at one time been afoul of the law and inquiry proved that a warrant for his arrest had been filed up in Sierra county. This warrant was immediately forwarded here with the resulting arrest of Nemecc by Blackerby.

Nemecc came here as the result of the reported gold strike and new process for extracting same. It was not larned what the specific charges are that have been placed against Nemecc.

Records show that one Frank E. Nemecc was found guilty on a charge of mail fraud at Wilmington, Delaware, in February, 1940, and was sentenced to four years and to pay a fine of \$1000.
