## Favorite Recipe

The favorite recipe of Mrs. Beth Simon is published this week:

### MAYONAISE CAKE

- 1 cup mayonaisse
  - 1 cup sugar.
  - 3 teaspoons cocoa or ground chocolate.
  - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
  - 1/4 teaspoon salt
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla
  - 1 teaspoon soda.
  - 1 cup boiling water.
  - 1/2 cup chopped dates
  - 1/2 cup chopped nuts
  - 1 1/4 cups flour.
- Mix hot water, soda, nuts and dates, and let stand. Mix all the other ingredients except flour. Add dates and nuts. Beat well, then add all at one time. Makes two layers. Bake 30 to 35 minutes at 350 degrees. Frost with chocolate butter frosting.

## Oregon Names

**Cayuse** (Umatilla county) The Cayuse Indians dwelt in the eastern part of Oregon. The term "cayuse" now is used throughout the western states to describe an Indian pony.

**Cazadero** (Clackamas county) Spanish for hunting place.

**Chemawa** (Marion County) The origin is obscure; possibly Indian for our old home.

**Chiloquin** (Klamath County) "Chaloquin" was a Klamath Indian family name.

**Clackamas** (County) The Clackamas Indian tribe hunted in the northwestern part of Oregon.

**Clatskanie** (Columbia County) Corruption of "Flatskani," place in the Nehalem region.

**Clatsop** (County) The Clatsop Indians inhabited the lands along the mouth of the Columbia river.

**Columbia** (River) In 1792 Robert Gray, a New England mariner, sailed into the mouth of the great river which he named for his ship, Columbia. The Columbia is the second largest river of the United States. It rises 1215 miles up in the Canadian Rockies and flows to the Pacific ocean. The Britannica describes it as "one of the world's greatest hydroelectric power streams."

**Coos** (county) The Coos Indians lived in this region.

**Coquille** (Coos County) Perhaps from the French coquille, meaning shell.

**Corvallis** (Benton county) Condensed from Latin words meaning heart of the valley.

**Crater** (lake) This lake of fabulous blue coloring is located in the crater of an extinct volcano, Mt. Mazama. It is one of the deepest lakes in the world. Crater lake national park embraces 160,213 acres.

**Crook** (county) Major-General George Crook was a celebrated Indian fighter.

**Crooked** (river) The river, in its course, twists and curves during most of the distance.

**Curry** (county) George Curry was a pioneer secretary of Oregon territory.

**Dallas** (Polk County) George M. Dallas was vice-president of the United States during the administration of James K. Polk.

**Deschutes** (County) The swift-flowing Deschutes river was named

from the French "Riviere des Chutes," meaning river of the falls.

**Detroit** (Marion County) After Detroit, metropolis of Michigan.

**Donner Und Blitzen** (river) When U. S. cavalry troopers had crossed this stream during an electric storm in 1864, they named it for the German words meaning thunder and lightning.

**Douglas** (county) Honors Stephen A. Douglas, democratic nominee for President in 1860.

**Eagle Cap** (mountain) The tire Wallowa range was known as the Eagle mountain because of the many eagles in the crags. Eagle Cap, 9670 feet is the "hub" peak of the Wallowa from which nearly all the ridges and granite ridges stem.

**Emigrant** (Butte) The emigrants traveled on the old Oregon route.

**Eola** (Polk county) From "Aeolus," the Greek god of winds.
