### State Offers GI's School Aid, Too

Thousands of Oregon veterans of World War II are receiving educational aid grants from the state to attend high schools, colleges and universities. Director George E. Sandy of the Department of Veterans' Affairs reported Governor Earl Snell this week. The thousandth man to be approved for the state grant of \$35 a month for a maximum of 36 months was Donald Arthur of Portland, who will use the benefits to attend night classes at Lincoln high school in that city. One hundred grants were made in the past three months, as many had been made in the previous year. Any veteran who was a resident of Oregon for one year immediately prior to his entry into the service, and who served 90 days more and was honorably discharged is entitled to the state benefits for 36 school months. He cannot receive state and federal school aid at the same time, as explained, but can take one first and then the other as so chooses. The state school aid was approved by the 1945 session of the legislature, upon the recommendation of Governor Snell. 10,000 students now receiving aid are enrolled in 67 active schools in Oregon, and eight out-

of-state schools. The state law permits out-state grants in exceptional cases when the veteran is desirous of some particular specialized training. Oregon men in out-state schools are attending John Hopkins university, Harvard, and one, A. Julius Ramburg, of Canby, is studying at the University of Copenhagen in Denmark.

A total of about \$500,000 already has been pledged from department of veterans' affairs funds to assist these veterans in obtaining their education, Sandy said.
