### ARM NEWS

**M. Knox, County Agent**  
**HUNDRED SEVENTEEN GROWERS IN FLORIDA**  
... of the state department of agriculture, recently visited the county agent's office at Gold Beach, providing this information of interest to lily men. He is quoted from the 1946 report of the Florida department of agriculture. The report lists 100 of these growers having a total acreage of 100 acres. The number of commercial lilies produced and marketed from this acreage was listed as 40,000. This information supports the following facts:  
1. 100 commercial growers are producing 40,000 acres in Florida. Each of these growers average about one acre which yields 40,000 commercial lilies. This information should be of value to the specialty crops

committee scheduled at Gold Beach for the first meeting.  
Crucial problems, producing and marketing particularly, will be considered by this committee on this basis. Our lily industry will be determined largely by the recommendation of this committee.  
It is now definitely apparent that lily growing must meet the competition from other areas.  
This information leads us to believe that Curry county producers will be able to compete on the basis of production costs. Final recommendations will be drafted by the committee and will be published for general use.
