

W. Auxiliary Announces Nat'l Essay Contest

Prizes Will
Total \$2000 For First
Four Winners

The Auxiliary to Post No. 966 Veterans of Foreign Wars announces that "The Home—Craze Good Citizenship" has been chosen as the title for the Twelfth Nationwide Essay Contest. The 1946-1947 contest is open to any student in a public, parochial junior or high school in the United States, Alaska or Hawaii. A thousand dollars cash will be awarded national winners. The grand prize will be \$1000 and a medal. The second grand prize will be \$500 and a gold medal. The third grand prize, \$250 and a gold medal; fourth grand prize, \$100 and a gold medal.

There will be 20 consolation prizes of cash. While there will be no restrictions as to how the prize is to be spent, it is hoped it will be used for further education.

The contest has the endorsement of educators and editors all over the county. In the 1945-46 contest, F. L. Schlagle, Kansas City, Kansas, then president of the National Educational Association of the United States, and later in the international guild organization, was one of the national judges.

Mr. Schlagle served with Dr. James E. West, New York, Chief Scout of the Boy Scouts of America, chairman of the judges committee; and Charlotte Straus, New York, school editor of the magazine Seventeen.

Mrs. Rulla, chairman of the essay contest for the local post auxiliary, said, "We hope every student will enter the contest. Essays must be in the hands of the Auxiliary chairman, not later than midnight, April 1, 1947. The names of national winners will be announced at the 34th National Encampment of the Ladies Auxiliary to the V. F. W."

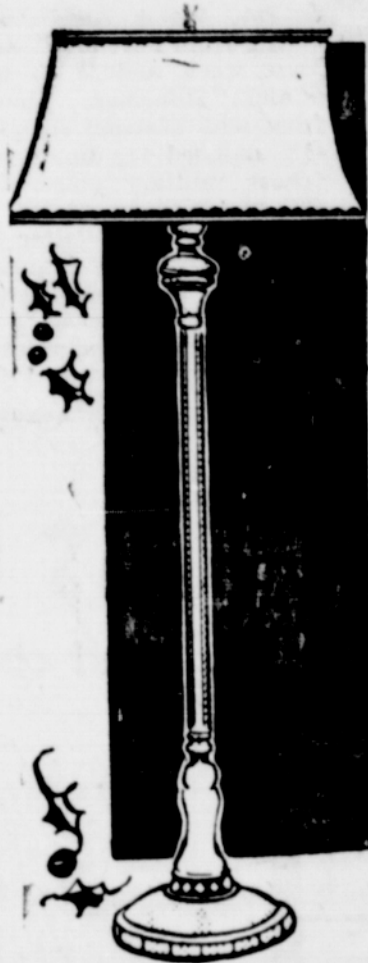

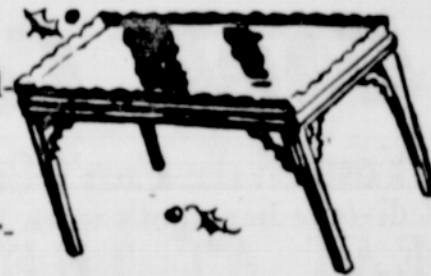
