"God the Preserve of Man" will be the subject of the Les- son-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, De- cember 15.

The golden text will be "As the mountains are round about Jerus- alem, so the Lord is round about his people from henceforth even for ever" (Ps. 125:2).

Among the cotations which com- prise the Lesson-Sermon will be the following from the Bible: "And Jesus departed from thence, and came nigh unto the sea of Gali- lee; and went up into a mountain, and sat down there. And great multitudes came unto him, hav- ing with them those that were lame, blind, dumb, maimed, and many others, and cast them down at Jesus' feet; and he healed them (Matt. 15:29, 30).

The lesson-Sermon also includ- ed the following correlative pas- sages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddq: "Stand porter at the door of thought. Admitting only such conclusions as you wish realized in bodily results, you will control yourself harmoniously: When the condition is present which you say induces disease, whether it be air, exercise, heredi- ty, contagion, or accident, then perform your office as porter and shut out these unhealthy thoughts and fears. Exclude from mortal mind the offending errors; then the body cannot suffer from them (page 392).

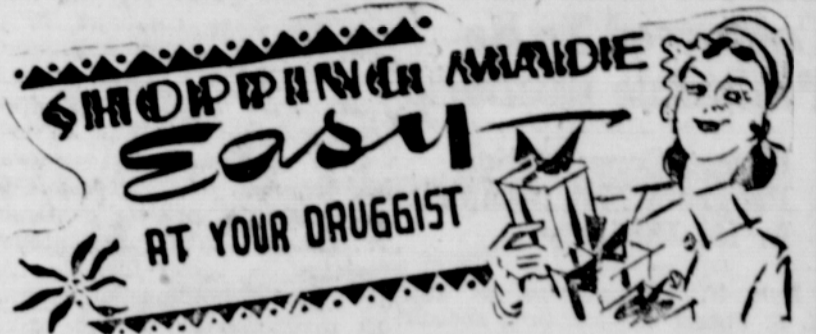
