First Grade Wins P.-T. A. Contest

With a percentage of 66.6, the first grade room, under Mrs. DeMoss, won the award for the local P.-T. A. membership drive, and was presented a permanent phonograph needle and records, filling the expressed desire of class and teacher. In explanation of these percentages:

Of the 22 pupils, and one teacher in this grade, there is possible P.-T. A. membership of 45. This grade signed up 30.

Second Grade: 27 enrolled, 55 possible, with 14 signed up. Class percentage, 25 1/2.

Third grade: 26 enrolled, 53 possible, 23 enrolled with a percentage of 41 1/2.

Fourth and Fifth Grades: 33 enrolled, 67 possible with 18 enrolled in P.-T. A. or 12%.

Fifth and Sixth Grades: 30 en-

rolled with 61 possible, and 18 signed for a percentage of 29 1/2.

Seventh Grade: 21 enrolled, 43 possible, with 10 signed. Percentage—23 1/4.

Eighth Grade: 26 enrolled, 53 possible, with 13 signed to make the percentage 24 1/2.

High school: 82 enrolled with possible P.-T. A. membership of 169, and 27 enrolled. Percentage for high school, 16.

With 267 pupils in the local school system, 92 P.-T. A. members were signed out of a possible membership of 547, or 16%. Additional membership cards are ordered, and if anyone wishes to join, they may do so by contacting Mrs. Lulu Goldizen.

The small percentage of the high school students' parents becoming members of the P.-T. A. leads one to believe that encouragement is needed for boys and girls at that vital age. Parents, apparently indifferent, need to know many things vital to the welfare of the children in the local school. Parents are becoming as delinquent as children about the financial investment in this community of the school.

The local school board, the faculty, and a few active P.-T. A. members are trying to improve educational facilities in the local schools. Every child needs an opportunity, and each parent is obligated to do his part toward the welfare of his children.

Further proof of the indifference in this community was seen at the Dec. 5, meeting of the P.-T. A. when only 11 were present. The local group has been asked to send three representatives to the pace conference at San Francisco.
