Local Squad Takes Advantage of Every Scoring Opportunity

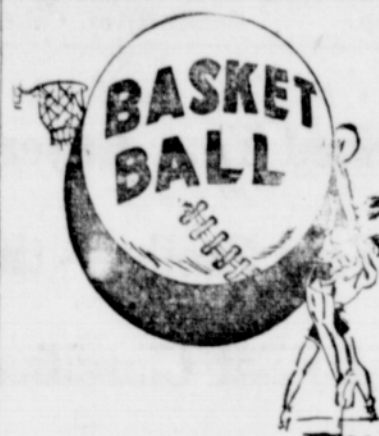

Crescent City Here Tonight

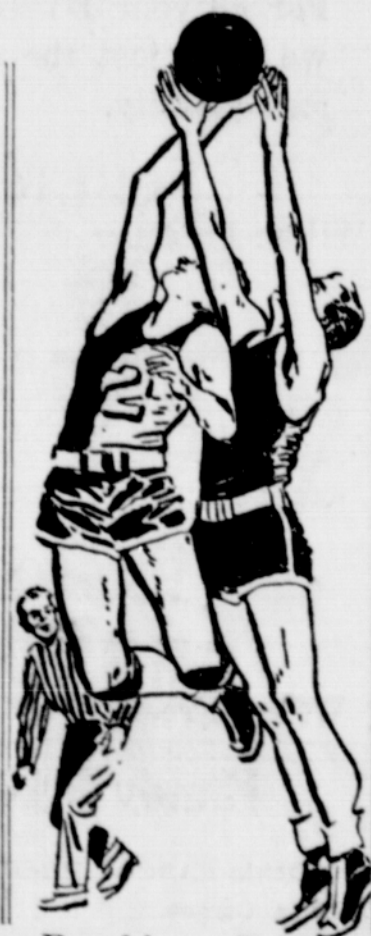
Fans of this area will get two games this week, when the town team books a return game with Crescent City tonight at the local gym.
