

### Veterans To Head On Job Training

The Oregon state apprenticeship council, which is charged with the responsibility of approving all apprentice training programs in the state of Oregon, will recommend to the 1947 legislature that veterans be appointed to its council by amending the apprenticeship law, Labor Commissioner Wm. E. Kimsey announced late last week.

Kimsey said this recommendation was approved unanimously at a recent state council meeting at Salem, after Director George E. Sandy of the department of veterans' affairs urged veteran representation on the council due to the fact that the majority of job training approvals in Oregon

is for veterans drawing subsistence under the GI bill of rights. Kimsey is chairman of the state apprenticeship council.

The council will ask for an amendment to add three veterans to the state body—one man representing management, one from labor and one from the public at large.

At the same meeting Lorrin H. Andrews, state apprenticeship director, reported that 781 training agreements between apprentices and employers had been approved for the months of September, October and November, making a total of 2600 now approved in Oregon. Virtually all these are veterans, Andrews said.

The State Council is working hard, Andrews further reported, to meet federal regulations requiring all job training programs to be re-examined and approved by state apprenticeship council by January 1, in order that trainees can continue to receive their GI subsistence allowances. Public Law 679, passed by congress last August, provides that veteran subsistence funds for job training will be cut off in those programs lacking state approval.
